Teaching aids for school going children

2023-24

Introduction - Common examples include timers, flip charts, world globes and flashcards. Teaching aids are usually not subject-specific (as props are) – a timer for example can be used in any subject.

Types of teaching aids

Two are the different types of teaching aids that we will discuss here.

- **Visual aids**. Teaching aids that include learning through a visual presentation are called visual aids
- **Audio aids**. This teaching aid targets to improve the listening and communication skills of the students

Audio-Visual Aids. 1. Visual Aids

Teaching aids which include learning through visual representation is called visual aids. Visual aids are the kind of material that we can see with our eyes. It is the most important teaching aid that teachers always use in their teaching-learning process everyday like book, blackboard, chalk, duster, indicator, picture, map, graphs, charts, posters, bulletin boards, museums, projectors and also important visual aids.

- **Ground substance**: The ground substance is the substance that the student can see and touch. The student inspects and examines by touching and observing matter, which develops the students' senses, as well as the development of his thinking, understanding and observing power.
- **Model**: When the actual substance cannot be brought into the classroom or its size is so large or it is not available then teachers prepare its sample or model which is shown in the classroom so that the student can easily be explained.
- **Image**: Pictures affect students very much. Students are lost in reality by seeing pictures, so teachers also present any story or science or any other subject related picture to the students so that they can be shown and explained. The things taught through the picture can be remembered by the students for a long time, as well as the pictures can be easily shown in the classroom.
- Map: We use the map only when we have to teach the students about historical events and geographical elements or places. While using the map, teachers should take care of some points such as names, titles, directions and signs etc. should be written on it.



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- **Sketch**: We need a drawing only when we do not have any real substance or model or map. In such conditions, we show students by drawing a drawing or sketch on a blackboard or on a whiteboard, like making a map of India, showing any state etc.
- **Graph**: A teacher uses graphs only when he has to show any increasing or decreasing pattern. A graph is used in many subjects such as geography, history, mathematics, science, or also to explain climate. And graphs are used to give information about population etc. as well. Also, the graph is most commonly used in teaching mathematics and science.
- Chart: The chart is used in Hindi, English, Geography, History, Economics, Civics, Mathematics and Science. For example, to show various forms of nouns in grammar in English or Hindi.
- **Bulletin board**: A bulletin board is a board where students display pictures, villages, figures, articles or essential information in relation to the country's political, economic and social problems. Bulletin boards continuously increase the knowledge of the students.
- **Museum**: The museum is also an important tool of education to increase the knowledge of the students in which all the objects are kept in one place, making the text more interesting and alive with these objects. The museum collects items that are very helpful in subjects like geography, history, mathematics, science.
- **Projector**: Projectors play the most important role among the most used tools in the modern education system. Teaching-learning is made more simple and interesting through projectors. Through the projector, the students get a different kind of enjoyment and memory, development of observational power, curiosity etc.
- Slides and Films: Slides and film are used as teaching aids and a projector is used for this. Slides of pictures or film strips can be shown by the projector in a sequence to give students knowledge.
- Globe: With the help of the globe, children are shown the boundaries of continent, ocean, river, and mountain. In the topic of geography, the globe is used for the most part, to tell students about the shape of the earth, northern and southern hemisphere, and latitude and longitude lines.



(Abstract):

प्रस्तावना (Introduction)

मानवी जीवनात वाचन संस्कृतीला फार महत्त्व प्राप्त झाले आहे.

विकासाच्या दृष्टीने

माणसाच्या मनपटलाच्या जडणघडणीसाठी महत्त्वाची भूमिका वजावत असल्यामुळे वाचनसंस्कृती रूजू लागली, तेव्हापासून मानवाच्या प्रगतीच्या कक्षा रूदावत जाऊ लागल्या आहेत. मानवी जीवनात वाचनाच्या सवयीमुळे जगातील अनेक दुर्लक्षित सितिजे दृष्टीपथास थेऊ लागली. नव्यानध्या शोधाच्या कक्षा समृद्ध होऊ लागल्या. अनेक ज्ञानकेंद्रे पुस्तकरूपाने एका पिढीकडून दुसऱ्या पिढीकडे हस्तांतरित होऊ लागले. माणसाच्या प्रगतीत व त्यांच्या उन्नतीत वाचनसंस्कृतीने मोठ्या प्रमाणात हातभार लावला, एवढेच नव्हे तर ही वाचनाची संस्कृती विकसित होत गेल्यामुळेच माणसाच्या उनुंग असा विकासक्रम सातत्याने सुरू राहिला.

वाचनसंस्कृतीचे विविध टप्पे :

मानवी जीवनाच्या आरंभीच्या काळात लिपीचा शोध लागला नव्हता. चित्रलिपी माणसाच्या आदानप्रदानाचे साधन म्हणून कार्य करीत होती. भाषेचा शोध लागला आणि त्याबरोवर लिपीच्या शोधाची प्रक्रिया सुरू झाली. लिपी म्हणजे भाषेला प्राप्त झालेली चिन्हव्यवस्था ठरली. या चिन्हव्यवस्थेने भाषेला चिरकालित्व प्राप्त करून दिले. लिपीच्या अद्ययावत शोधाच्या पूर्वी भुजंपत्र, ताप्रपट, शिळेवर भाषेला हस्तलिखिताद्वारे लिपीवद्ध करण्याची पद्धती सुरू झाली. ही पद्धत फार टिकावू अशाप्रकारची नव्हती. तिला काळाच्या मर्यादा होत्या. तिला ऊन, पाऊस, वारा आणि अग्नीच्या मर्यादा होत्या. हस्तलिखिताद्वारे अनेक प्रती करून ठेवणे अशक्यप्राय झाले होते. तरी सुद्धा या काळात इतर माध्यमांवर लिहिलेले लेखन वाचनाचा एक कालखंड तयार झाला होता. या माध्यमाद्वारे केले आणारे वाचन व्यापक प्रमाणात नव्हते आणि या वाचनसंस्कृतीला विविध मर्यादा होत्या. मानवी जीवनाच्या

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मर्यादित समूहाकडून त्या काळात वाचन संस्कृती जोपासली

मुद्रणकला ही वाचनसंस्कृतीच्या वाढीसाठी आणि मानवी जीवनाच्या विकासासाठी अत्यंत महत्त्वाचा टप्पा ठरली. मदणकलेने लिपीचे काम सोपे केले. या कलेमुळे मर्यादित स्वरूपात असलेला वाचन व्यवहार व्यापक झाला. मुद्रणकलेच्या उमगापूर्वी एका वेळी अनेकांना एकाच पुस्तकांच्या अनेक प्रती वाचने शक्य नव्हते; पण या मुद्रणक्रांतीनतर एका पुस्तकांच्या अनेक आवृत्ती एका वेळी प्रसिद्ध होऊ लागल्या. एका वेळी अनेक लोकांपर्यंत एकाच आशयाची माहिती पोहचू लागली. वाचनसंस्कृतीचा हा परमोच्च काळ ठरला.

वाचन व ज्ञानप्राप्ती :

वाचन हे जगातील ज्ञानाच्या प्राप्तीसाठी एक अत्यंत प्रभावी माध्यम आहे. आजच्या माहिती तत्रज्ञानाच्या युगातही वाचनाने मिळणाऱ्या ज्ञानाचे महत्त्व कमी झालेले नाही. चांगल्या पुस्तकांच्या वाचनाने जो आनंद मिळतो तो अवर्णणीय असाच असतो. ज्याला चांगल्या वाचनाचा नाद लागला असेल त्याच्या करमणुकीला सीमा नाही. चांगल्या वाचनसंस्कृतीच्या जतनाचे खूप चांगले परिणाम होताना दिसतात. गोपाळ गणेश आगरकर यांनी वाचन व ज्ञानक्षेत्र यातील सबध दर्शविताना पुढीलप्रमाणे सांगितले आहे. ते म्हणतात, ''ज्याला निरनिराळ्या देशांत निरनिराळ्या काळांत कोणकोणत्या प्रकारचे लोक होते, ते कशा प्रकारचे पेहराव करीत, त्यांची राज्यपद्धती कोणत्या प्रकारची असे, त्यांच्या धर्मकल्पना कशा होत्या, ते कोणते खेळ खेळत, ते न्याय कसा करीत, ते व्यापार कोणता व कसा चालवीत, त्यांच्यामध्ये धर्मक्रांती व राज्यक्रांती होण्यास काय कारणे झाली. नंतर त्यांच्या स्थितीत कोणकोणते फेरफार झाले, ऐन संकटाचे प्रसंगी मोठमोठे पुरुष कसे वागले, कोणाच्या बुद्धिसामर्थ्याने जगावर केवढे उपकार झाले, अनीति, भित्रेपणा, यादवी इत्यादी दोघांनी कोणती राष्ट्रे लयास गेली, उद्योग, न्याय, धर्मपरायणता व एकी इत्यादी गुणांनी कोणती राष्टे उन्यास आली, इत्यादी गोष्टी समजून व्यावयाच्या असतील त्याला त्या समजण्यास वाचनाखेरीज दुसरे साधन नाही''' याप्रकारे वाचन व जगातील ज्ञान यांचा अन्योन्य संबंध आगरकरांनी सांगितला आहे. ज्ञानाबरोबरच वाचन माणसाला सुसंस्कृतपणा शिकविते. आगरकर म्हणतात, ''वाचन मनुष्याचे वर्तन सुधारते व त्याला रानटीपणांत राह् देत नाही.''? माणसाच्या बौद्धिक, सामाजिक आणि सांस्कृतिक विकासाचा महत्त्वाचा टप्पा वाचनसंस्कृतीमुळे शक्य झाला आहे असे म्हणता येईल.

तंत्रज्ञान युग आणि वाचनसंस्कृती

सध्याच्या काळाला माहिती तंत्रज्ञानाचे युग म्हणून ओळखले जाते. या युगाने मानवी जीवनात मोठ्या प्रमाणात परिवर्तन घडून आल्याचे दिसून येते. मानवी जीवनाच्या प्रत्येक क्षेत्रात या तंत्रज्ञानाने प्रवेश केला आहे. लेखन व वाचनाचे क्षेत्र सुद्धा या तंत्रज्ञानातून सुटलेले नाही. गेल्या पाच सात वर्षात तंत्रज्ञानाचा विकास ज्याप्रकारे झाला आहे त्यामुळे विविध क्षेत्रात चांगले वाईट परिणाम झाल्याचे दिसून येते. मानवी व्यवहार मोठ्या प्रमाणात बाढला. दूरवर राहणाऱ्या लोकांशी क्षणात सवाद साधता येत आहे. तासन्तास माध्यमांसमोर बसून वेळ खर्ची घालता येतो. पण वाचनासाठी वेळ देता येत नाही ही फार मोठी शोकांतिका ठरत चालली आहे. तंत्रज्ञानानी विकसित केलेली माध्यमे विविध क्षेत्रात आणली जातात ही चांगली गोष्ट आहे. यात कोणाचेही दुमत नाही. पण ज्यांना मानवी जीवन व्यवहारात या माध्यमविश्वाचा उपयोग करण्याची संधी नाही ते फक्त मनोरंजनासाठी आणि वेळ घालविण्यासाठी माध्यमविश्वाचा उपयोग करीत आहेत. या कारणाने प्रत्यक्षपणे पुस्तक वाचनासाठी त्यांच्याकडे वेळ नाही.

प्रत्येक व्यक्ती हा आयुष्यभर विद्यार्थी असतो. विद्यार्थी होऊन राहणे हीच प्रकृतीही आहे आणि संस्कृतीतीही आहे. वाचन संस्कृती जोपासणारा विद्यार्थी असणे ही एक सतत प्रवाही, सतत जिवंत आणि सतत सर्जनशील असलेली संस्कृती आहे असे म्हणता येईल. वाचनाने विद्यार्थ्यांचे जीवन समृद्ध होते. त्यांच्यात विचार करण्याची वेगळी विशेष चक्षुवृत्ती विकसित होते. यशवंत मनोहर विद्यार्थ्यांच्या वाचनसंस्कृतीबद्दल म्हणतात, ''विद्यार्थ्यांने बुद्ध, चार्वाक, सॉक्रेटिस, हिरॅक्लिटस, पायथॅगोरस. शोक्सपियर, ऑरिस्टॉटल, मार्क्स, रसेल, फुले, आंबेडकर, न्यूटन अशा अनेक शास्त्रज्ञांची, तत्त्वज्ञांची आणि प्रतिभावंताची चरित्रे आणि विचार काळजीपूर्वक वाचले पाहिजेत. आपला विषय कोणताही असो. इंग्रजीतील, हिंदीतील, मराठीतील अनेक मौलिक आणि श्रेष्ठ कादंबऱ्या, नाटके, काव्ये, कथा, वैचारिक निबंध असे साहित्य वाचायलाच हवे. त्यातून आपले भाषिक कौशल्य वाढेल आणि जीवनासंबंधी किंवा मानवा मनासबधीची जाणीव समृद्ध होत जाईल.''३

बदललेले माध्यमविश्व व वाचनसंस्कृती

तंत्रज्ञानाच्या प्रगतीनुसार सध्याच्या काळात मोठ्या प्रमाणात माध्यमविश्व बदलत आहे. प्रसारमाध्यमांमध्ये मृद्रण प्रकाराबरोबरच इलेक्ट्रानिक्स माध्यमांचा शिरकाव झाला आहे. वृत्तपत्राच्या व इतर नियतकालिक व अनियतकालिकांच्या मुद्रित प्रतींबरोबरच सॉफ्ट स्वरूपात आता येऊ लागली आहेत.

प्रत्यक्षपणे कागदावरून वाचलेला मजकूर जेवढा सहज, वाचनीय आणि ग्रहणशील असतो तेवढा सॉफ्ट स्वरूपातील नसतो. कागदावरचा मजकूर हा आपल्या नजरेपुढे असतो. सॉफ्ट स्वरूपातील मजकूर जाणीवपूर्वक उपलब्ध करावा लागतो. या कारणाने अशा मजकूरांना वाचनासाठी आपले लक्ष जात नाही. हा मजकूर वाचताना आपल्या डोळ्यावर ताण पडण्याची शक्यता असते. मोबाईलचा पडदा छोटा असल्यामुळे वाचनाच्या दृष्टीने त्रास होतो. या सर्व गोष्टींमुळे सॉफ्ट स्वरूपातील मजकूराकडे वाचकांचे लक्ष वेधले जात नाही, उलटपक्षी अशा माध्यमांवर चित्रफित किंवा ध्वनिफित पाहणे आणि ऐकणे याला जास्त महत्त्व प्राप्त होते. वाचनसंस्कृतीवर या नव्या माध्यमविश्वांचा निश्चितच प्रतिकुल परिणाम होताना दिसतो.

प्रत्येक मनुष्य वाचन करतो म्हणजे ज्ञान संपादन करीत असतो. ज्ञानाने माणसाच्या जीवनात आमुलाग्र परिवर्तन घडून येते. वाचन हे ज्ञान संपादनाचे अत्यंत प्रभावी असे माध्यम आहे. वाचनाने जीवन समृद्ध होते आणि मानवी जीवनाच्या कक्षा वृंदावतात. या विषयी यशवंत मनोहर म्हणतात, ''विद्या म्हणजे ज्ञान. ज्ञान हे जसे विषयाचे असते. तसे ज्ञान संपूर्ण जीवनाचेही असते. जीवन जगण्याचे ज्ञान म्हणजे विद्या. आपण वेगवेगळे विषय शिकतो. है सर्व विषय जीवनातूनच उगवलेले असतात. ते जीवनासंबंधीच असतात. प्रत्येक विषयाची प्रतिज्ञा आपल्याला जीवन समजावून देणे हीच असते. आपापल्या पद्धतीने हे सर्व विषय जीवनाचाच अभ्यास करत असतात.'' मनोरंजन हा वाचनाचा हेतु पूर्वीही होता आणि आताही आहे. माणूस हा रंजकप्रधान प्राणी आहे. पण याचबरोबर जीवनाविषयी गंभीर असणे हा त्याचा स्वाभाविक गुणधर्म आहे. त्यामुळे मनोरंजनाच्या पलीकडे तो वाचन संस्कृतीकडे गंभीरतेने पाहत असतो. पण आजच्या बदललेल्या माध्यमविश्वाचा विचार केल्यास वाचनाच्या बाबतीतील ही गंभीरता संपत चालली आहे असे ध्यानात येते. सध्याच्या माध्यमविश्वाचा विचार करता समाजमाध्यमे हे फार प्रभावीपणे या क्षेत्रात काम करताना दिसतात. वाट्सॲप, फेसबुक, एक्स, यासारख्या समाज गाध्यमातून व्यक्ती प्रकार होताना दिसा आहे. या माध्यमाद्वारा एकमेकांशी जोडले जाण्याचा व संवाद साधण्याचा प्रयत्न केला जात आहे. पण हे माध्यम मोठया प्रमाणात मनोरंजनात व अफवा पसरविण्यात गुंतले आहे. या माध्यमांना दीर्घ स्वरूपाचे लेखन नको आहे. छोटया छोटया आशयाचे रंजकप्रधान लेखन या माध्यमांसाठी पूरक ठरतात. ही माध्यमे रंजनाला महत्त्व देतात. गंभीरतेपेक्षा पोकळ गोष्टी या माध्यमांचा विषय होताना दिसतात. त्यामुळे या माध्यमांवरील लेखनासाठी लेखक म्हणून कोणी फारसे जबाबदार नसतात. या कारणाने या लेखनाची

विश्वासहार्यता राहत नाही. हे लेखन सामाजिक, राजकीय, सांस्कृतिक आणि धार्मिक क्षेत्रात प्रभाव टाकू शकते. पण यांचा विपरित परिणामही मोठया प्रमाणात जाणवताना दिसतो.

बदललेले माध्यमविश्व व वाचन संस्कृतीवरील धोके

बदललेल्या माध्यम विश्वाचा प्रसाराचा झपाटा फार मोठा आहे. काही क्षणात एखादा मजकूर असंख्य वाचकांपर्यंत घेऊन जाण्याची क्षमता या माध्यमांमध्ये आहे. समाजमाध्यमांवर येणारे अनेक मजकूर वाचकांद्वारे वाचले जात नाही. ज्यांना वाचावेसे वाटते ते या माध्यमांवर फारसा विश्वास ठेवत आणि अनेक वाचक तर न वाचताच अनेक गटांमध्ये फारवर्ड करतात. त्यामुळे या बदललेल्या माध्यमविश्वाला वाचनसंस्कृती जोपासली जावी याची चिंता नसते बरोबर वा चुकीच्या गोष्टीविषयी कुठल्याही प्रकारचा सारस्य न ठेवता. जास्तीत जास्त लोकांपर्यंत <mark>जाणे आणि आपला प्रभाव टाकणे यावर या माध्यम विश्वाचा</mark> जास्त जोर असतो. त्यामुळे या अशा माध्यमविश्वाने जोपासलेल्या वाचनसंस्कृतीमुळे असंख्य धोके निर्माण होतात. चुकीच्या पद्धतीने मजकूर आल्याने समाजात अफवा पसरतात आणि त्याचे विघात<mark>क परिणाम समाजाच्या स्वास्थावर पडतो. बरेचदा</mark> अशा चुकीच्या पोस्टम्ळे समाजासमाजात तेढ निर्माण होते. आजच्या बदललेल्या माध्यमविश्वामुळे वाचनसंस्कृतीची दिशा बदललेली आहे हे लक्षात येते.

बदललेले माध्यमविश्व व वाचनसंस्कृतीची जोपासना

सध्याच्या काळात बदललेल्या माध्यमविश्वाच्या अनुरूप वाचनसंस्कृती वृद्धिगत करायची असेल तर माध्यमांच्या अतिरेकापासून दक्ष राहणे आवश्यक आहे. सध्याचे माध्यमविश्व वाचनसंस्कृती जोपासण्यापेक्षा तिला असुरक्षित करण्यात जास्त लक्ष केंद्रित करताना दिसत आहे. वाचनसंस्कृती जोपासायची असेल, तर माध्यमांचा अतिरेक थांबवावा लागेल. आजच्या काळात लहान मुलांच्या हातात पुस्तकपेनच्या ऐवजी मोबाईल दिला जात आहे. बालवयापासूनच मुलांना चित्रफितींची ओळख करून दिली जात आहे. बालकांनी एका ठिकाणी स्वस्थ बसावे, एका ठिकाणी बसून घ्यावे, बालकाचे रडणे थांबावे इत्यादींसाठी पालकांकडून मोबाईलची स्क्रीन हा पर्याय निवडण्यात येतो. बालकांपुढे पुस्तक ठेवण्यापेक्षा मोबाईल देणे पालकांना जास्त सोयीचे वाटते. तरुण, वृद्ध, महिलासुद्धा मोबाईलपासून स्वतःची सुटका करून घेऊ शकल्या नाही असे चित्र पढे येताना दिसत आहे. अशावेळी वाचनसंस्कृतीच्या वाढीसाठी काही उपाययोजना करणे आवश्यक आहे. ह्या उपाययोजना वैयक्तिक पातळीवर पूर्णत्वाला जाऊ शकतात. जसे समाजमाध्यमांच्या किंवा इतर प्रसारमाध्यमांच्या संपर्कात

येण्याची निश्चित अशी एक वेळ आपण ठरवून दिली पाहिजे. इतर वेळी चांगल्या पुस्तकांचे वाचन केले पाहिजे. बालकांना मोबाईलपासून दूर ठेवण्याची काळजी घेतली पाहिजे. आपण पूर्व दूरघ्वनीचा वापर एका विशिष्ट ठिकाणी ठेवूनच करीत होतो. तसाच मोबाईलचा वापरसुद्धा वापर बऱ्याच अंशी एका ठिकाणी राहून केला पाहिजे. वाचन हे मोबाईलवर न करता मुद्रित माध्यमांद्वारा केले गेले पाहिजे.

निष्कर्ष:

- १) बदलत्या माध्यमविश्वामुळे वाचनसंस्कृतीवर दूरगामी परिणाम झाल्याचे दिसून येते.
- विविध प्रसारमाध्यमे व विविध समाज माध्यमे वाचन संस्कृतीच्या वाढीस पूरक नाहीत हे लक्षात येते.
- वाचनसंस्कृती वृध्दिंगत करावयाची असेल तर इतर माध्यमांचा गरजेपेक्षा जास्त उपयोग करणे थांबवले पाहिजे हे निरीक्षणातून दिसून येते.
- ४) माध्यमांचा अतिरेकी वापर हे महत्त्वाचे कारण वाचन संस्कृतीच्या ऱ्हासासाठी कारणीभूत ठरू शकते असे दिस्न येते.
